Ladies and Gentlemen,

in the world where ideas and discoveries circulate at such a pace that it can shorten their life to the time necessary for reading just one headline, we stick to the slow craft: reading and editing books several (or even dozen or so) times, translating without cuts, when needed publishing books with added critical apparatus and going back to the backlist, because literature needs time to take root.

Publishing is a job of public trust and books are the civilisation's infrastructure; they preserve memory, teach complexity, slow down the judgement, reinforce the curiosity and the shared imagination. As a publishing house connected to Kraków, the Global UNESCO's City of Literature, in the year of the PEN International Congress having taken place in Kraków, we call to mind the European axiom: freedom of publishing is an everyday practice of democracy and social responsibility.

Why are books irreplaceable?

- Because they provide us with a language to express experiences before they get seized by slogans,
- Because they permanently link facts with their context (and remember their sources),
- Because they teach unwillingness to accept simple answers and the violence of simplification,
- Because they build bridges: between disciplines, generations, languages.

You can find the results of such a view on publishing in our catalogue: from new, international editions of the classics and careful translations, through to brave fiction and non-fiction, to poetry and books on art. And the conscious custody of the backlist.

Classics that are alive

Wiesław Myśliwski in yet more international editions: in the autumn we will see his *Needle's Eye* published by Archipelago Press (trans. Bill Johnston) and *The Palace* published by Quercido (trans. Karol Lesman). At the same time we work on new editions of the Nobel Prize Winner's works: we go back

to Wisława Szymborska – her biography written by Joanna Gromek-Illg, *The Distinguishing Features*, lands in the hands of Italian readers with Elliot Edizioni (trans. Giulia Fasoli), the English-language version is also in the pipeline. In the autumn we will also publish the first anthology of Paweł Huelle's short stories, *Lucky Days*, a selection which completes the image of the author so far known mainly for his novels.

Space for the authors looking for new ways of telling stories

Małgorzata Lebda's *Voracious* has already conquered ten foreign markets. Waiting for new ones, we introduce Łukasz Staniszewski, a new, brilliant name, to the global market, and his highly original novel, *The Songs of Piebald Cows*. His fiction combines discipline of form with bold imagination. We also present Filip Zawada's book, *If Not for the Black*, a novel that is sensitive to the everyday rhythm, ironically wise and unsettlingly shrewd.

Non-fiction – the real world with no shortcuts

Tomasz Stawiszyński's new book combines the precision of an essay with the courage to ask questions we usually avoid. Zbigniew Rokita in his *Agglo. By the Banka All Over Silesia* takes the reader along the paths of memory and identity of the region, showing how local stories reflect global tensions. Piotr Tarczyński in *Slimy Tentacles, Obvious Powers. The History of America in Conspiracy Theories* uncovers the mechanics of conspiracy theories in America and shows why it's so easy for them to colonise the public discourse. Portrait of Karolina Lanckorońska, written by Marcin Wilk, completes this set. It's a biography which restores the complexity of her person, usually reduced to the role of a symbol.

Crime novels and series – bold intrigues

We choose plots that are set up with literary precision. Maciej Siembieda in *Stone Run* follows an investigation rooted in reality, constructed of details which mean more than it may seem at first. Marek Krajewski starts a new series with *A Voice from Hell* and with this book restores the elegance of

the genre, plunging it into the dark territories of history. For younger readers we have Adam Marek's *Something Stinks Here*, an intelligent and irresistibly funny story which teaches children how to think scientifically and follow a trail.

Art, design, poetry – attentive observation

Aleksandra Koperda's books about design and space show how the attentive observation can become an everyday aesthetic practice. These are stories about things, but first and foremost about ways of life. They are completed by poetry: new collections from Tomasz Różycki, Tomasz Pietrzak and Anna Piwkowska offer word as a form of attention, respite and conversation with tradition. Each of these titles was prepared with care for editorial detail, because we believe that the beauty of the packaging amplifies the voice.

Translators – ambassadors of Polish culture

In Znak we believe that international reach of literature depends to a large extent on translators. Which is why for years we have collaborated with the leading ones; their craft, sensitivity and intuition are key to the quality of our editions. We look forward to the Congress of Translators which will take place in Kraków in 2026, and we continue to organise meetings with translators in our offices in collaboration with the Book Institute.

Frankfurt remains the place where we discuss not just the latest books and co-productions, but also the industry standards: reliable editing, transparent metadata, long-term custody of the catalogue. When we say **Books matter**, it's not just a slogan, it's a promise to deliver quality and to be brave. Come talk to us about our new titles and about the ideas that might help us bear the unpredictability of tomorrow.

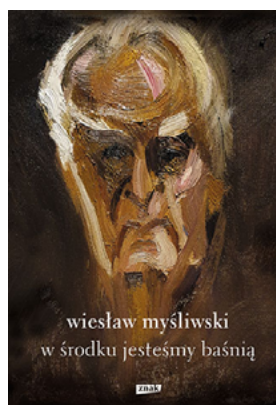
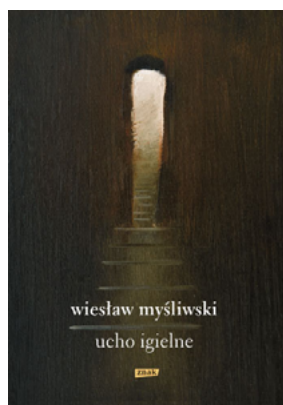
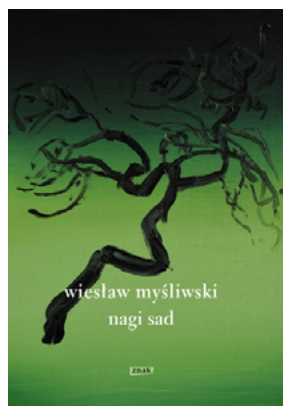

Wiesław Myśliwski *The Needle's Eye*

About the book:

A gripping novel that asks fundamental questions about human existence.

The story begins with an enigmatic meeting between two men on a steep stairway leading to a “wild old green valley,” in a defile known as the Needle's Eye. A tragic incident triggers the action. Who are these men and what is their relationship? Who is the mysterious girl in the photograph that one of them keeps on him?

In this masterfully constructed book nothing happens by chance; each scene has its own significance, like a step on a stairway. Gradually we learn the story of the central character: his childhood in a small town during the war, his youth spent under communism, and finally old age in present-day Poland. We're with him in his family home, on walks with the girl, in boarding houses, rented apartments; we see him as a schoolboy, a college student, and finally as a history teacher. From time to time we go back with him to visit his parents, with whom he is close, painfully watching them growing old and moving “toward silence.” History leaves its stamp on the lives of the protagonists, including on those parts that remain unspoken.

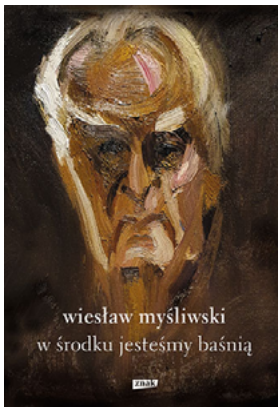

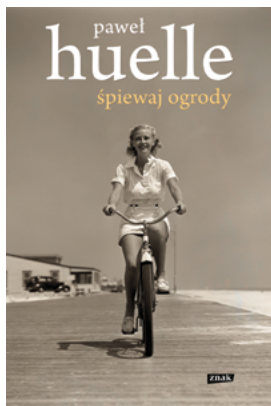

He worked as a university lecturer, journalist and director of the Gdańsk branch of the Polish Television. Many years later, when Danzig has been captured by the Russians and the German citizens are being deported, the narrator's father is given accommodation in Greta Hoffmann's house. In the 1950s, the little boy who will grow up to tell the story about the Frenchman, Wagner and the Hoffmanns, befriends Greta, who is now an old lady. Greta teaches him German and shows him the vanished world of the Free City of Danzig.

This is a very beautiful, superbly constructed novel about a bygone world where a variety of cultures, traditions and ethnicities interacted; about the Free City of Danzig and how Wagner's mysterious opera changed the life of another composer and his wife; about the Pied Piper of Hamelin, and how another procession of rats came pouring through the streets of Danzig in sombre silence; about music in the shadow of Hitler, literature in the shadow of crime, love in the shadow of war, and about the unusual friendship between a small boy and an old lady.
