Classics which remain alive

It's quite extraordinary that the books of Wieslaw Myśliwski – a literary master whose prose is like meditation on the human fate – find readers both in Poland and across the globe. In Znak we believe that the classics of literature are not museum exhibits, but a living voice which resounds, generation after generation. Which is why, apart from Myśliwski, we keep going back to Wisława Szymborska, Czesław Milosz and Józef Czapski, bringing back their works in new, beautiful editions and inspiring readers across the world to meet these books anew.

New literary revelations

However Znak is not just big names, it's also the space for new, brave voices. We publish books by Malgorzata Lebda, whose prose pulsates with the rhythm of nature and tender attentiveness, or by Emilia Dłużewska, in whose writing we discover contemporary sensitivity and humour lined with melancholy. We want to be a publishing house that always looks for – and finds – literary revelations.

Biographies and reportage – the world in words

In the world which often seems to be inexplicable, non-fiction provides a compass. Biographies – such as the intimate portrait of Wisława Szymborska written by Joanna Gromek-Illg; or books by Magadalena Grzebałkowska, who, with a reporter's astuteness, brings to light obscure characters and people of flesh and blood – these are books that help us to better understand

people who formed our history and culture. And reportage books written by Zbigniew Rokita, Marcin Kącik and Tomasz Patora are all attempts at capturing the most difficult themes, the ones forcing us to ask questions about the truth, memory and responsibility.

Philosophy and wisdom for difficult times

We live in the era of questions and doubt. Which is why we proudly bring to London books by Józef Tischner and Leszek Kołakowski, as well as contemporary essays by Tomasz Stawiszyński which help the reader to find their way in the chaos of modernity. Philosophical writing was always a mainstay at Znak, now it becomes more topical than ever.

Literature which crosses the borders

For years Znak has been building its position also on the international stage. Our books are published in translation in many countries, from Czechia to the United States. Wisława Szymborska's biography will land in the hands of readers in Italy and Britain, Tischner provides inspiration in Italy, Polish reportage finds their readers in Germany and in Czechia. This shows that literature deeply rooted in our history can still speak the universal language – the language of values, questions and the truth.

Our mission is publishing books that stay with the readers for longer, books that matter not just in the year of their publication, but also decades later. Literary fiction, essay writing, biographies, philosophy books, reportage – all of those come together within Znak. For over sixty years Znak has simply meant good literature.




About the book:


The first edition of Wiesław Myśliwski's collected dramas.




















Wiesław Myśliwski at ZNAK

Wiesław Myśliwski **The Needle's Eye**

A gripping novel that asks fundamental questions about human existence.

The story begins with an enigmatic meeting between two men on a steep stairway leading to a "wild old green valley," in a defile known as the Needle's Eye. A tragic incident triggers the action. Who are these men and what is their relationship? Who is the mysterious girl in the photograph that one of them keeps on him?

In this masterfully constructed book nothing happens by chance; each scene has its own significance, like a step on a stairway. Gradually we learn the story of the central character: his childhood in a small town during the war, his youth spent under communism, and finally old age in present-day Poland. We're with him in his family home, on walks with the girl, in boarding houses, rented apartments; we see him as a schoolboy, a college student, and finally as a history teacher. From time to time we go back with him to visit his parents, with whom he is close, painfully watching them growing old and moving "toward silence." History leaves its stamp on the lives of the protagonists, including on those parts that remain unspoken.



About the book:

As the eighteenth century comes to a close, François de Venancourt arrives in Gdańsk. When young girls and boys start to go missing from the neighbourhood, nobody suspects the genial Frenchman. Nor does anyone hear the moans of ecstasy or the groans of agony as he tortures his victims in the cellar of his mansion.

Towards the end of the 1920s, German composer Ernest Teodor Hoffmann buys the house from de Venancourt's heirs, and moves into it with his wife Greta. Both of them are involved with the Forest Opera based in Zoppot, which is renowned for its performances of Wagner. Ernest Teodor has never had a high opinion of Wagner's work or the ideology behind it, but he is aware of the rising power of Hitler. Only when he pays a visit to an old antiquarian in Budapest and finds the mysterious manuscript of an unfinished opera does he start to believe in Wagner's greatness. From then on, he is determined at any cost to complete the work, which is about the Pied Piper of Hamelin. News of Wagner's lost opera soon spreads within the Free City of Danzig and into the Reich beyond, and Ernest Teodor becomes entangled in the web of history on a grand scale.

Many years later, when Danzig has been captured by the Russians and the German citizens are being deported, the narrator's father is given accommodation in Greta Hoffmann's house. In the 1950s, the little boy who will grow up to tell the story about the Frenchman, Wagner and the Hoffmanns, befriends Greta, who is now an old lady. Greta teaches him German and shows him the vanished world of the Free City of Danzig.

This is a very beautiful, superbly constructed novel about a bygone world where a variety of cultures, traditions and ethnicities interacted; about the Free City of Danzig and how Wagner's mysterious opera changed the life of another composer and his wife; about the Pied Piper of Hamelin, and how another procession of rats came pouring through the streets of Danzig in sombre silence; about music in the shadow of Hitler, literature in the shadow of crime, love in the shadow of war, and about the unusual friendship between a small boy and an old lady.

Michał Witkowski **The Faith. Autobiography**

The boy one day would become the literary voice of his generation full of pride in his gay identity.



About the book:

In a beautiful way about the ugliness of the interwar period. Witkowski's grand come back in the costume of a retro crime novel.

The end of the 1920s. The landscape after a feast. The great crisis arrives. And afterwards the hangover.

Late autumn, November. Chief Inspector Adolf Piątek starts an investigation into the case of a cruel murder of a tenor singer from the local operetta. The first suspect is the singer's lover, a gigolo working at a local dance hall where every night he seduces wealthy women. Each woman he dances with disappears without a trace. But there is more. In the dead man's apartment Piątek finds evidence which might link the singer to a series of cruel murders committed years before, known as "the Cook's case".

Witkowski portrays the world on the threshold of disaster, where the smell of blood mixes with the smell of vodka, onion, the Shalimar perfume from Guerlain, forbidden sex and decomposing bodies.

The eponymous Flora is deputy prioress "for earthly things" in a Discalced Carmelite Nuns monastery.

She knows how to pickle cabbage, she goes shopping, she leads processions. Virgin Mary reveals her truths to Flora, one of the little people, who in turn serves them to the folk in form of supplements. Prioress Anna a Jesu, sanctified while still alive, must swallow her pride and adapt. And anyway she is not as saintly as she seems to be. The ground under the monastery has its secrets, too, quite literally.

With his debut novel, Stanisław Syc bursts into the Polish literature scene. According to reviewers, the story is weird, queer, and the style resembles a mixture of a sermon with a mediaeval long poem. And this mixture is explosive, its language daring. A splendid debut.

About the book:

A vivid and eloquent autobiographical novel about the hopeless struggle to find one's own unique place in the world while burdened with a dysfunctional family.

The most recent novel by Filip Zawada is set against a bleak backdrop of communist Poland. The novel is a bildungsroman narrated by a nameless man who describes his childhood, adolescence and young adulthood over a span of about twenty years. The narrator is an antihero - an angst-ridden, insecure, awkward and lonely boy who lives in the shadow of his sadistic and unpredictable grandfather. Larger than life, selfish and gruff, Grandpa Szczepan spends his days on an old couch from a Ukrainian brothel and terrorizes his neighbours at night with the roar of his saxophone. For the narrator, his grandfather - an old-school chauvinist, racist, anti-Semite, misogynist, unapologetic womanizer and a pain in the ass for his family and everyone else around him - is an object of hatred and a symbol of everything that's repulsive. The narrator lives in fear, however, that one day he'll become like his grandfather. This is a book about visceral hatred bubbling at the core of a family, and about intergenerational trauma that resonates throughout subsequent generations.

This literary *tour de force* is about an orphan raised by nuns, a sensitive kid who discovers the world without feeling sorry for himself and sails out onto the wide waters of his imagination.

The protagonist of the book is an accomplished journalist who ends up on a therapist's couch. She is supposed to help him deal with a crisis caused by a divorce with his wife. From this point on our protagonist wanders around Warsaw at night, meets numerous people who – like ghosts from the past, present and future – help him face his life, fears, doubts, sadness and uncertainty which entered his life and force him to redefine values and look for new meaning.

They were stripped of dignity. Few met good people on their paths, others had to take care of themselves.
